With the announcement at the beginning of the seminar by Director Randy Koubeck of the tragedy that had struck two Ohio State Troopers in Gallia County, reminded us of how fortunate we all are.

During the seminar, David Zeis, a retired Ohio State Patrol employee won the 50/50 raffle for \$114.00. Mr. Zeis immediately stood and stated that he wished to donate his winnings, along with an additional donation, to the families of the trooper and sergeant that were injured fatally in the crash. The OATIA Board also met and has decided to donate the Association's half of the proceeds from the 50/50 to the families as well. Additional contributions were also made during the seminar for the two families; bringing the total contribution to the families to \$268. **SUMMERY OF STOLEN CHEVY PICK UP**  
**Youngstown Fire Department Fire Investigation Unit**  
*CAPTAIN ALVIN WARE, Youngstown Fire Department*

My investigation started after Engine 12 found a burned out vehicle at the intersection of Winton & Knapp. Upon Engine 12's arrival at the scene, they found the passenger compartment of a dark green Chevy pick up truck on fire. They found that the truck had been stripped of the engine, front fenders, hood, doors, interior, dash, tail lights, transmission, and gas tank.

The vehicle was examined at Bob O Towing, and determined that the fire had been started in the passenger compartment. The vehicle was a newer Chevy pick up truck, but with the engine and transmission gone along with all the public VIN numbers removed from the vehicle. No license plate was on the vehicle, and the color was determined to be dark green in color from the rear of the truck that did not burn in the fire. It was also determined that the vehicle had been totally stripped before the vehicle was set on fire.

Because no plates or VIN was on the vehicle, contact was made with State Trooper Mike Russell to find the hidden numbers. Trooper Russell was able to find the hidden VIN numbers on the vehicle that were 1GCHK29153E157809, and this vehicle was found to be a stolen vehicle reported stolen from the Columbian County Sheriff Office. The vehicle was stolen from Rollerena Auto Sales.

I talked to the owner of Rollerena Auto Sales, Harold Feezle, who stated that a black female came in, and wanted to take the Chevy pick up for a test drive. At the time, they were very busy so a sales man let her take the 2003 Chevy Silverado, dark green in color, for a test drive. She never returned the vehicle, and so they reported it stolen to the sheriff office. Mr. Feezle stated that Lorenzo Brooks had been to the car lot a week prior to the date the truck was stolen. They wanted to take it for a ride, but he and another male had no driver's license, and were not permitted to drive the vehicle that date. Mr. Feezle also stated that he had received a number of calls from Youngstown about this vehicle, and also stated that he thought that Mr. Brooks had had something to do with this truck being stolen.

On 12/07/2005, while at was at the YPD Auto Theft Office with Detective Mike Walsh, a phone call from Harold Feezle from Rollerena Auto Sales was received. He stated that he was at Sammartino Welding at 155 West Indianola, and believes his stolen truck parts/engine/trans/and other parts of his 2003 Chevy pick up were brought in by Lorenzo Brooks to be installed in his 1976 custom motor home. The vehicle was towed to Sammartino by Ludsts Towing. Detective Walsh talked to Dyane Sammartino who stated Lorenzo Brooks wanted the engine installed. Dyane asked Brooks where the parts came from to be installed, and he said they came from Margula Trucking.

On 12-08-2005, Officer Simon YPD, Sgt. Odomosi, Capt. Ware YFD, and Trooper Mike Russell went to Sammartiono Welding at 155 West Indianola and informed the owner of the on going investigation. He gave us permission to check the vehicles in his shop. Officers observed a custom truck on a Chevy frame belonging to Killer Brooks Racing, and the owner of the truck was Lorenzo Tim Brooks. We made a check of the VIN numbers on the engine and the transmission, and they all matched to the same VIN number 1GCHK29153E157809 which were taken from the stolen 2003 Chevy pick up truck. We also found the two mounting brackets in the cab of the truck that are from the stolen pick up truck, and also found 3 booklets in Mr. Brooks's truck that were from the stolen truck. The documents included the owner manual with all of the owner info on the front page, and the warranty book that also was from the stolen vehicle. The motor home was towed to Bob O Towing with a hold for Auto Theft, and the other items were logged into YPD evidence room.

Mr. Lorenzo Brooks was charged with receiving stolen property by Capt. Alvin Ware. This was bound over to the Mahoning County Grand Jury where Mr. Brooks was indicted on the charge. Mr. Brooks plead to the charge in Judge Cronin's Court, and he received 3 years under community control. He also faces a probation violation since he was still on probation from prison at the time of the incident.

**Elyria** – Auto mechanics, electricians, and carpenters are not people you would expect to investigate arsons. But they do in Lorain County. The Lorain County Fire Investigators Unit is the only group in Northeast Ohio with more than 60 volunteers dedicated to fire investigations. "No other unit functions like this one," said Matt Hartnett, a deputy state fire marshal.

The unit is made up of volunteer and full-time firefighters and law enforcement officials. All of the members use their individual job training to investigate fires when arson is suspected. "Everybody learns from each other," said Lorain County Sheriff's Sgt. Randy Koubeck, the group's leader.

The team responds anywhere in the county if a fire chief requests it. The county's 18 townships don't have the resources to hire fire investigators, Koubeck said. The unit's work has led to convictions. Members have responded to about 20 fires this year. Fire departments cannot rely on state fire marshals to investigate every fire, Koubeck said. Because of the fire unit's work, the Sheriff's Office was able to arrest a Lorain man five hours after a Sheffield Township home exploded on Valentine's Day 2005. The man and three other people were charged with arson and insurance fraud.

The fire unit is recognized by other first responders in the county. The county's Emergency Management Agency has given the group access to its resources, including its mobile command center.

Every member of the unit has completed a basic fire investigation course, and continuing education courses are required. They meet monthly to discuss training methods and view photos of fires. "Each fire is a learning experience for us," Koubeck said.

**Fire Dept Ruse Nabs Fake Caller Suspect Friday, December 29, 2006 7:17 AM EST**

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. (AP)

Knoxville Fire Department investigators used a ruse of their own to nab a man suspected of making a series of bogus emergency calls on his cell phone. After receiving a false report of a gas leak on Dec. 14, firefighters compared notes. They confirmed 15 fake 911 calls over a two-month period, including four house fires, six car crashes and various other medical emergencies. All came from the same cell phone.

So they called the number and left a message saying the phone's owner had won a gift card from a major retailer, Fire Capt. Brent Seymour said. Within an hour, Seymour received a call back from a man identifying himself as the phone's owner. "He willingly gave his name and address," Seymour said. "I told him I would be sending that gift card." But that wasn't quick enough to suit the man. He wanted the gift card in time for Christmas.

So the investigators set up a meeting for that evening. Seymour said he waited only a few minutes in a business parking lot before suspect Jason Mark Harms arrived on foot, identified himself as the gift card recipient and was arrested. Seymour said Harms' first words were, "You can't prove it." But General Sessions Judge Charles Cerny found the evidence strong enough Wednesday to send 15 felony counts of making false reports against Harms to a Knox County grand jury.

Harms, 29, told authorities he thought he was doing taxpayers a favor by drawing otherwise lazy firefighters out of their cozy fire halls, according to court papers.
